

Tropical Storm *Eta* moves north from Cuba toward Florida's west coast

A tropical storm warning is in effect for the Dry Tortugas, a group of islands west of Key West. *Eta*, about 315 miles south-southwest of Tampa, is moving north-northeast at 9 mph. Now with **65 mph winds**, the storm could reach minimal hurricane strength over the coming days, but it is expected to weaken as it approaches Florida's Big Bend area.

Subtropical storm *Theta* sets a record

Meanwhile, subtropical storm *Theta* formed in the Atlantic Ocean on Monday night, making 2020 the most active hurricane season on record with 29 storms so far.

No watches or warnings are in place as *Theta*, now a tropical storm, will travel east and stay in open water before dissipating, according to the National Hurricane Center.
